Since the middle ages,</i> <i>the western Church has ranked Augustine as one of</i> <i>its four Doctors.</i> <i>In his Confessions, Augustine tells of the searching</i> <i>that went on throughout his life, and he writes about</i> <i>the very essence of the Christian life. The Confessions</i> <i>reveal to us a man who was passionate about life, and</i> <i>his desire for prayer whereby he could give God</i> <i>praise and at the same time open his heart to God</i> <i>whom he knew to be merciful.</i>
