Minutes of the Meeting of Little Abington Parish Council on Monday, 22 July 2019 at 7.15 pm in the Abington Institute Great Abington.

1. Apologies for absence. Mr. Allum and Cllr John Batchelor.

### 2. Minutes of last meeting.

The minutes of the meeting held on 24 June 2019 were agreed without any changes.

The Chairman agreed to change the agenda order to take public participation first

# 5. Public participation: Granta Park noise nuisance

Some residents in Westfield continue to be disturbed by noise coming from TWI/ Granta Park. It is worse when there is a southerly wind and on still days. It is very disruptive in the hot summer weather - disturbing sleep and outdoor activities.

The residents are logging the noise and they are keeping TWI up to date. A recording of the noise made in the early hours of the morning was played to the Parish Council. It was thought the issue would have been resolved before summer. It was understood that remedial works were due to be completed by the end of June, but TWI have said they are waiting for their contractor to complete the work. Residents were disappointed and frustrated by the slow progress.

Environmental Health (EH) was consulted at an early stage. They said the noise level was not actionable. EH recommended working with an acoustic engineer but as far as the residents are aware TWI have not done this.

The Chairman agreed to write to the Chief Executive of TWI. There was some discussion about compensation for residents. The Clerk noted concerns about noise were raised in a response to a planning application in 2014.

Both members of the public left the meeting at 7: 35 pm.

## 3. Matters arising not on the agenda.

The action list was reviewed and updated.

• Comfort Café/lorry parking. SB contacted the Chief Executive of Paragon. (They own the Comfort Café site). Their planning application has been delayed because the Greater Cambridge planning team does not have the capacity to deal with it. He thought they would apply at the end of the year. He said the company was keen to work with the Parish Council to make sure the design of the site was acceptable and to resolve concerns about lorry parking. They had considered opening the site for lorry parking but they were surprised by the quantity of litter and dirt that was left. Reopening the café was not an option because the amount of work required to bring it up to standard could not be justified. Paragon did not know about the proposal for a Park & Ride site nearby. He thought it was a good idea in principle.

- Tree overgrowing 19 Church Close. This is still not been resolved. The tree is in the garden of 26 High Street which is owned by the Cambridge Cottage Preservation Society. The house is not occupied at present so it would be an ideal opportunity to take remedial action.
- A1307 Parishes Forum. The group met on 10 July. They had agreed a letter about biodiversity should be sent to the County Council on their behalf.
- Exposed storm drain A1307. CCC replaced the cover. A resident had kindly offered to do it.

#### 4. Members declarations of interest. Nil.

# 6. Report from Cllrs Batchelor

The written report was received. It was noted that SCDC has appointed a new Chief Executive. The following items were not included in the report

- A1307. The County Council is consulting on a traffic order to reduce speed limits near Linton. Cllr Batchelor was not aware of any plans for resurfacing Cambridge Road in Little Abington although it was needed. A short stretch of road on the outskirts of the village was resurfaced earlier in the month.
- **Election arrangements**. A consultation on the suitability of polling stations is in progress. LAPC has no concerns about arrangements in the Abingtons.
- Children's Centres. It is two years since the service was reconfigured. The
  County Council is seeking feedback from local groups. Linton and Sawston are the
  centres closest to Little Abington.
   CLERK to raise through Parish Nurse team

There was some general discussion about working arrangements between SCDC and other local authorities. The relationship between them and the Greater Cambridge Partnership is not clear.

#### 7. Planning

## 7.1 Planning applications:

• S/2336/19/FL 31A Cambridge Rd, Single storey front porch extension & alterations. The Clerk was not aware of any comments from neighbours. LAPC supported the application without referral to the SCDC Planning Committee

#### 7.3 Local Developments

- ARCC Innovation Centre, Great Abington Exhibition 11 July. LAPC was not represented.
- New Local Development Plan VAA and PB attended a workshop on 17 July.
   A summary and presentations from the meeting are awaited.

The aim is to develop a spatial strategy for the next 20 years. A draft should be available by the end of 2020; final publication due 2024.

The sites worthy of consideration following the request for sites suitable for housing development through the Strategic Housing Land Availability Assessment (SHLAA). will be published soon. Filtering them is time consuming. Delegates had reflected on the previous process. The importance of effective consultation and recognising the value of local knowledge and advice was emphasised. The process was too long; inspection in public had slowed it down and delays had allowed speculative, poorly planned developments.

It would be important to get the right mix of housing and to ensure collaboration with, and alignment of policies of, local authorities and other agencies.

VAA joined the meeting that 8.15 pm

- **Greater Cambridge Local Planning update**. Noted. The supplementary guidance on village design might be useful.
  - The Parish Council did not plan to reply to the consultation on Greater Cambridge Greenways closing date 5 August. It was agreed to submit a response to the consultation on the Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Draft Local Transport Plan closing date 27 September. C/F Sept agenda. **CLERK**.
- Fighting Funds. A principle was agreed that LAPC would consider requests from other parish councils to contribute towards the cost of fighting funds for controversial developments if the developments were likely to have an impact on Little Abington and the immediate area. The level of a contribution would need to be carefully considered in relation to LAPC's budget and priorities, current spending and the need for LAPC to be able to afford the cost of legal or technical advice on any developments or other matters in Little Abington. A contribution of £3000 towards a fighting fund for the Uttlesford Garden Village was not affordable. It might be helpful to work with Great Abington Parish Council to agree a common approach.

# 8. Highways and traffic

- **Greater Cambridge Partnership**. Whittlesford Parkway station area improvements LAPC's response to the consultation was submitted on time.
- Local Highways Improvements. Some comments were received from residents. Most related to issues in Great Abington. Speed and road safety on Pampisford Road were being addressed through Speedwatch. Traffic on Newmarket Road is often over the speed limit but Speedwatch is not permitted there.
   LAPC agreed to consider submitting a bid for Moveable Vehicle Activated Speed signs. They could be used on Newmarket Road and at other locations. There were some practical considerations such as responsibility for changing locations and battery charging. It was suggested that Granta Park should be asked to contribute towards the cost. Cambridgeshire police had suggested contacting two companies. Their quotations had been received.

Cllr Batchelor left the meeting at 8.35 pm

# 9. Village Environment/ community engagement

- Litter bin for top Bourn Bridge Rd. LAPC did not agree to purchase a litter bin because it was unlikely to be used by passers-by. Residents who pick up litter could use the bins at Fourwentways and Bourn Bridge Road. The bins at Cambridge International School (CIS) might be another option.
- Litter. Pupils from CIS had done a project on litter on Newmarket Road and on
  the route along Bourn Bridge Road into the village. They found litter was
  scattered without any concentrations. There were some branded items from the
  outlets at Fourwentways but the source of most of it was not identifiable. The
  highest number of items picked up were plastic wrappers and plastic bottles.
  LAPC was grateful to the school for their input and would be happy to support
  them if they wished to repeat the project.

- Free access to Granta Park. It seemed unlikely that a mutually acceptable solution to reopening the site could be found. Walking access via the main gate is not a practical option for most residents of Little Abington.

There is a summary of expenditure year to date on the website. There were no variances of concern against the budget plan at the end of Q1. However late invoices from CCC would result in a significant variance in expenditure at half year. VAT for Q3 &4 2018-19 had not been received. CCC has been invoiced for the grass cutting grant. It was noted that the Clerk's hours are marginally above plan. The Clerk was concerned about projected levels of expenditure compared to plan due to late invoicing by the County Council and discussions about contributing to fighting funds. If income or expenditure goes over £25,000 LAPC will be subject to external audit resulting in additional costs for clerk's time and external audit fees.
