Letter from the Editor

We shall all be pleased to see 2020 come to an end. Rapidly spreading Covid-19 and government lockdowns brought disease and death, major disruption to education, livelihoods lost and, for human beings who naturally crave company, prohibition of shared activities, and isolation and loneliness. It helps that we live in attractive villages with easy access to outdoor space and the abundant plants, birds and other wildlife around us. Now here we are, nearing 2021 and with a realistic hope that an effective vaccine against the virus will be available in weeks and signal better times ahead.

Covid and lockdown prompted a truly remarkable community response with the rapid creation of Love Abington and an army of volunteers to provide good neighbourly help with shopping, collecting prescriptions, a foodbank, telephone listening service, local library and more. The Village Stores accepted telephoned and online orders and offered a delivery service. The Three Tuns supported local events and provided meals for schoolchildren when government support was lacking. The churches arranged services via Zoom and then adapted to outdoor services conducted with social distancing. The PTFA devised ways to keep the children occupied and maintain fundraising. Parish Councils have continued to deal with planning issues, road and transport projects and, with an eye to a greener future, have purchased an e-bike for villagers to try out. Hildersham is celebrating the 100th anniversary of the Village Hall and has exciting future plans. See pages 4-5, 6-7, 10-15,16.

Page 8 reminds us of the plight of refugee children in foster care in this area who will be cheered by donated Christmas presents. We hope that there can be more togetherness at Christmas, including Christmas Day services in church (pages 4-5, 20). To spread a little joy, everyone is encouraged to put up Christmas lights early. On Christmas Eve the churches ask us all to put a lighted candle in the window. At 6pm on Christmas Eve please join worldwide rejoicing with two minutes of bellringing on the doorstep (page 7).

Lockdown in March led to TWI staff working from home and ended 15 years of TWI printing this magazine free of charge, for which we are truly thankful. Sincere thanks are now due to the Parish Councils of Great and Little Abington and Hildersham who have borne the printing costs since April. A sponsor has been found to pay for printing in 2021, of which more will be said in January.

From the Seven Churches

As we turn our gaze towards the Christmas season, we know it will be a Christmas like no other. At the time of writing there is no certainty about what we will be able to do. We'd like to have family and friends over, to sing carols together, to share joy and laughter but we are unsure what the pandemic guidelines will be. So many things we have always taken for granted seem up in the air!

It's a similar story with our Christmas church services. We will certainly have Zoom services each Sunday in December and on Christmas Day, but we don't know yet whether we will be able to hold services inside our church buildings or even outside them. We hope, however, to gather outside on the Sunday before Christmas or on Christmas Eve, to listen to carols and hear the story of the birth of Jesus.

So much uncertainty, at a time of year which usually feels traditional and familiar! Yet the Christmas story is actually a mix of uncertainty, fear, hope and new life. A child, brought into a world under the rule of Rome and born in difficult circumstances, is the Christ child who is greeted, as Luke's Gospel says, as "Saviour, who is the Messiah, the Lord". Good news conveyed by these simple words, which invite a lifetime's reflection: Jesus is "Emmanuel, which means, 'God is with us'". Words that speak of Jesus' identity and the work of the Spirit; that provide a testimony to the past, a witness to the present and hope for the future.

A traditional Christmas carol we often sing is '*O little town of Bethlehem*', written in the mid-19th century but still very popular today. The last words of this carol also declare that, in Jesus and through his Spirit, "God is with us": 'O come to us, abide with us, our Lord Emmanuel'. I hope we get the chance to sing this and other carols this Christmas and, in this time of uncertainty, hear the good news they proclaim.

County and District Council November report

A1307 update After protests by Parish Councils and Local Councillors there has been a U-turn on the decision to drop the plans for a lights-controlled crossing at Hildersham. The crossing is back on the table and work is going on to try and overcome the problem of land acquisition, that was one of the reasons the crossing was in doubt. We hope that local landowners will help to make this much needed safe crossing of the A1307 possible.

(Another) GCP consultation The GCP will be consulting on their preferred new off-road route between the new travel hub/park and ride site and Cambridge. The consultation is open now and closes on 14 December. The consultation documents can be seen online at <https://consultcambs.uk.engagementhq.com/cset-eia>

Covid Community Grant South Cambs. has released a new grant available for community groups supporting people with Covid related issues. There is £50,000 available in the pot and we will send around the details once the grant is live.

Resurfacing The County Council has released the latest list of roads which have been selected for a light resurfacing. These are namely: Linton – Chalklands, Palmers Close and Finchams Close, Castle Camps – High Street, Shudy Camps – Parkway, West Wickham – Maypole Croft. Some good news for the areas that are benefiting from this work, which is currently planned for the first two weeks in December.

Around the village

Reporting fly-tipping, incidents and more: You can report issues you see around the village direct to the relevant local authority. Details of whom to contact are given on our website: www.theabingtons.org.uk/parish-councils/report-fault-roads-lights-fly-tip/. For incidents you witness at Fourwentways (or elsewhere) please contact the police – the more evidence they receive that an area is problematic or dangerous, the sooner we will see changes.

Speedwatch: We will be restarting our Speedwatch sessions around the village in the new year after a winter break partly enforced by the latest lockdown. We are delighted that Paddy Keane, who lives in Moorefield Close, is going to take over the co-ordination role.

Buddy bench: The wooden bench on the corner of Church Close has a new status – as a bench where new friendships can be formed. We are encouraging people to use it as a place to make new friends as well as meet old ones.

Bonfires: Please do not light bonfires one hour before dusk or leave them burning overnight and avoid them when the weather conditions will cause an inconvenience to your neighbours.

Meeting via Zoom, Monday 26 October

The Council discussed the Cambridge South East Transport project and the Linton Greenway. Some areas of concern are: the pedestrian and cycle access to the P&R from Abington will be over the A11 footbridge, and this is also part of the Linton Greenway cycle route to Cambridge, but the GCP does not say it will widen the bridge; the road layout could increase traffic travelling to the Fourwentways roundabout and lead to more congestion on Cambridge Road; the locations of the bus stops for the busway are on the outskirts of neighbouring villages so residents who want to travel to the Sawston medical practice or shops in Shelford will either have a very long walk or will use alternative means of transport; and as the P&R is on the Green Belt the impact needs to be mitigated and the GCP should say how many trees they will plant.

(We have the opportunity to comment on this until Monday 14 December on www.greatercambridge.org.uk/CambridgeSET. The GCP only listens when lots of people comment, so please make your views heard.)

In October, we donated £460 to East Anglia's Children's Hospices (EACH) making a total of £891 raised so far this year. We have already beaten our annual record and are set to raise more than £1,000 by the end of the year, which would be a truly remarkable achievement.

Our efforts have come to the attention of EACH Fundraising, who would like to feature the jam stall story in local media. Phillipa Graham asked if we could send a write-up and some photos and they have now prepared a press release. She can't guarantee that it will be picked up but will do her best.

We are so grateful to our faithful supporters. Thanks to generous gifts of fruit - redcurrants, rhubarb, damsons and jostaberries, to name a few – we have a wide variety of preserves available on the stall. A huge thank you, too, to everyone who buys, donates jars and fabric and makes jar covers.

100 years of Hildersham Village Hall

Our much-loved Village Hall was purchased for Hildersham in November 1920. At a Parish Meeting, on 17 November 1920, it was agreed to buy one of the Government huts at a sale to be held on 23 November. The meeting was chaired by the Rector and a committee appointed of members Messrs. Taylor, Conder, Franklin and French. The hut itself would cost £83 12s and, after various costs incurred in dismantling, reconstructing and furnishing, the total would be about £140. This must have been a considerable sum at the time; it equates to around £6,300 today.

An extension to the hall was built in the 1970s and a Big Lottery grant in 2015 enabled extensive and much-needed refurbishment. However, the main structure of the hall is still standing after 100 years and has done the village proud. Currently, the hall is closed due to Covid restrictions, but we look forward to the day when we can reopen for classes, parties, quizzes and all the events that contribute so much to village life.

John Myer

John had been ill for some time, not that many would have known, such was his characteristic good humour, outgoing disposition and concern for the welfare of others. Childrens' Church Council

At their November meeting, the Childrens' Church Council (CCC) watched some videos to give them a deeper understanding of the challenges facing refugees. This engendered much discussion and confirmed the real need to offer presents at Christmas to the refugee children in Cambridge and the villages. The children of the CCC will have a Christmas tree decorating timetable in order to prepare safely the tree in Church under which the gifts will be placed.

The Council hopes to be able to hold a public meeting in the new year to register Parish Councillors as the Trustees for the two Trusts that will take responsibility for the Recreation Ground land and the allotment land, North and South Holding. Any possible changes to land use would require full consultation with the community, as well as getting authorisation from the Charity Commission to change the deeds of the Trust.

After many years as the volunteer Tree Warden for Hildersham, Carol Sinclair has stepped down. The Parish Council would like to thank her for her tireless work and energy planting new trees and ensuring that the mature trees were well maintained on the Recreation Ground. Helen Reynolds has kindly agreed to take on this role for the village.

After months of waiting for the concrete pillars to be available, the repairs to the fence near the entrance to the Recreation Ground are under way. The contractors plan to reuse the existing metal posts that fit into the concrete pillars.

Some of the safety improvements to the Hildersham crossing may not be possible, as the additional land required to build the scheme does not seem to be available for sale.

However, a local landowner is refusing to sell the small area of land required to construct the crossing and adjacent pathway. It is likely that GCP will now resort to a compulsory purchase order, both costly to the taxpayer and time-consuming, to enable this vital eco- and health- and lifestyle-beneficial scheme to proceed. A great shame to hinder outcomes that would be of huge benefit to many, not least our beleaguered environment.
