As we turn our gaze towards the Christmas season, hopefully we can look forward to far more opportunities to gather together than last year! It's part of the joy of Christmas time that we may see friends and family, sing carols together and share food and laughter. Knowing how we missed out on time with loved ones throughout the Covid crisis, the poignant sense of joy in being together may be even greater than usual this year.

Christmas services also allow us to come together in a special way: to hear the story of the birth of Jesus and to celebrate this good news with carols, praise and thanksgiving. Christmas services this year will be a mix of Communion services, Christingles and carols. Some carol services will be inside our churches and some outside as they were last year, when we wrapped up warm and used torches and candlelight! There will be details of all of our services on our website: www.grantavale.org.uk, on our church notice boards and on the Christmas card you will find with a copy of this magazine.

After all we've been through over the last year, I hope the strange beauty of the Christmas story may speak afresh into our lives this Christmas. A story which is a mix of uncertainty, hope, joy and new life. A child, brought into a world under the rule of Rome and born in difficult circumstances, is the Christ child who is greeted, as Luke's gospel says, as "Saviour, who is the Messiah, the Lord". Good news conveyed by these simple words, which invite a lifetime's reflection: Jesus is "Emmanuel, which means, 'God is with us'". A testimony to the past, a witness to the present and hope for the future.

A traditional Christmas carol we will no doubt be singing in or outside our churches, and one of my favourites is 'O little town of Bethlehem', written in the mid-19th century but still very popular today. The last words of this carol also declare that, in Jesus and through his Spirit, "God is with us": 'O come to us, abide with us, our Lord Emmanuel'. As we come together this Christmas, may we ponder anew this joyful and life-changing good news.

County and District Council

District and County Councillors' Report – November 2021

Local Plan Consultation

Following the publication, by the District Council, of the preferred sites for development, there is now a public consultation on these proposals that is live and runs until 16 December. The proposals are to concentrate all major development into existing and forthcoming settlements, such as Waterbeach, Northstowe, Cambourne etc. and leave the villages as they are, as villages. The documents can be commented upon here - <https://www.greatercambridgeplanning.org/localplan> . If people are broadly in favour of the principle of keeping major development in the existing settlements, please do comment and say so.

Enhanced Covid Response Area

Following the steep increase in positive Covid cases and hospitalisations in Cambridgeshire & Peterborough over recent weeks, central government has designated the county as an 'Enhanced Response Area' which means that we are allowed more funding to support the battle against the virus. It also means that some venues, such as schools, could enforce mask wearing again. So, the message is, the virus hasn't gone away, so please continue to act with caution.

Watercourse Reinstatement Grant

There is a grant available from the County Council to help address local flooding issues, specifically where the riparian owner either cannot be identified or is unable to undertake the necessary work themselves. Food waste collection trial_South Cambs. DC is currently undertaking a food waste collection trial – to see if splitting food waste out from general green waste reaps any tangible benefits. We will share the results of the trial once they are published.

20mph Zones_The County Council has started the process of reducing the barriers to creating more 20mph zones in Cambridgeshire's villages and towns. Currently the process is quite restrictive, as the criteria for 20mph zones are very rigid and officers tend not to deviate from them. Hopefully we will be able to announce that the County Council is able to relax the criteria somewhat in coming months.

New County Council Chief Executive The County Council is on the verge of appointing a new Chief Executive. At time of writing the decision is still confidential but I'm sure it will be publicised in local media, so do keep an eye out.



Over 400 trees have been planted at Coton Countryside Reserve to help the planet and celebrate the Queen's Jubilee. Twenty volunteers had fun planting the trees on Saturday 13 November, which took them two hours.

House Deeds - Can you help the Abington History Group?

The Abington History Group (AHG) exists to research the history of the villages of Great and Little Abington, and to share their findings with the local community. Recently we were lent the deeds of a house in the High Street which included data about ownership of the house going back to around 1900. This provided new and valuable information about properties in the Abingtons, some originally owed by Neville Pegg, the Estate Manager for the Emerson family in the 1920s.

If you do, AHG would be very interested in having sight of the documents to learn more about historic property ownership in the villages. Hildersham Parish Council

Report on the Hildersham Parish Council meeting held on 9th November 2021.

A post and wire fence has been erected around the area where the Parish Council plans to establish a copse. The 140 small trees (whips) are due to arrive at the beginning of December and councillors are keen to involve the community, including local children and youth groups in planting the trees. Please contact the Clerk or any councillors to let them know if you would like to get involved in planting the trees.

The Recreation Ground Trust and Field Garden Trust meetings are being held after each Parish Council meeting. The land previously administered by the parish council, including the allotments, the Recreation Ground, North and South Holding will be managed by the Trusts.

Building work to improve the A1307/Beech Row and Pampisford Road/A1307 junctions is due to start in the Spring of 2022. The Highways Dept. has asked if a site office can be installed in the South Holding for the duration of the construction work at the junction.

The new solar light and battery unit will be installed over the next few weeks, and if it works well, the council plans to install a similar unit in the bus shelter on the Hildersham side of the A1307.

The Highways Dept. has confirmed that it plans to paint the bridge over the ford once funds for the next financial year are available. The council had asked if the work could include all the hand railing too.

The council was very pleased with the new picnic bench for the play area which was kindly assembled and installed by Rob Clay.
