From the Seven Churches

Early this May we look forward to a historic moment in the life of our nation when we celebrate the coronation of King Charles III, as well as enjoying a Bank Holiday weekend. As someone who usually loves any excuse for a celebration, I am looking forward to gathering with others to enjoy this occasion! On that Sunday, we will also have a special service in each of our village churches when we will mark the coronation and reflect on the life and calling of Jesus, the Servant King.

Then, on the Monday of the Coronation weekend, the Church of England is joining with others in encouraging voluntary acts of service in our communities as part of the Big Help Out (for more information about the Big Help Out go to https://thebighelpout.org.uk/). This will be a good excuse to celebrate all the voluntary work already going on in our communities and to reach out to others and share our time and gifts. Perhaps consider how you might make a small act of kindness or service on that day, and reflect on the ripple effect it could create.

The last Sunday of the month will also be a special occasion when we celebrate Pentecost, sometimes known as the 'birthday' of the Church. At Pentecost we remember the gift of the Holy Spirit to the disciples gathered in Jerusalem after the resurrection of Jesus. This astonishing gift of God's Spirit, as described in the Bible in the book of Acts, bound together the early church in worship and shared life, and empowered them to reach out to others in the name of Jesus. Pentecost is therefore both a celebration and helps remind the church of its calling, as we seek to share the good news of life in the Spirit.

How wonderful that we can come together to mark such times and seasons in our lives and be grateful for all that is good around us. This can shape our sense of purpose, help us cherish the time we have, and increase our capacity for joy. It can also, as Pentecost reminds us, draw us more deeply into the life of the Spirit and lead us, in all the seasons of our lives, to praise, prayer and thanksgiving.

Christian Aid Week 14– 20 May This year Christian Aid is supporting Malawi where soaring costs of food and essentials are keeping people in desperate poverty. Children are robbed of the chance to go to school when their families can't pay the fees. Farmers are struggling to survive in the face of the climate crisis and its threat of devastating droughts, floods and storms. Christian Aid has worked in Malawi for 20 years empowering vulnerable communities to find practical and sustainable ways out of poverty. This gives them the skills to grow crops that are more resilient to the climate crisis, restore soil fertility, increase harvests, learn business skills and join co-operatives to earn more for their crops. Any contributions placed in the envelopes and put through the letterbox of the address on the envelope will be greatly appreciated and add to the village collection.

Abington Village Institute – appeal for volunteers

The booking information is also used to control the heating system in the various rooms so that rooms are warm when users arrive. Technology has moved on and so we are looking for someone who can produce a new, better system. It can be built from scratch, based on the existing one, or built out of online services that will work together to provide the overall system. This could be your project and within the needs of the Institute you would have relatively free rein and a budget to support the creation of the system.

We are also looking for someone to do the **invoicing of Institute users**. This is an essential role bringing in much of the money that allows the Institute to be maintained in a way we can all be proud of. The invoicing is currently linked to the booking system mentioned above although it could be done in other ways.

District and County Councillors' Report April 2023

Ukrainian guests

South Cambs has so far hosted more than 780 Ukrainian guests, more than any other district in the country. This is a great achievement and says much about the generosity of those who have opened their homes to people in need. We still have new people arriving and others moving on for one reason or another. South Cambs is calling again for more hosts to come forward. A1307 works

The last element the of cycle path should be nearing completion and work on the roundabout at the Bartlow Crossing will start in early May and go on for about 40 weeks. Combined Authority appoints new CEO

The Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Combined Authority has appointed Rob Bridge as the new permanent Chief Executive to take over from the interim CEO Gordon Mitchell, under whose leadership, the Combined Authority has been under a very significant programme of change and transformation. It would not be an understatement to say the Authority had a difficult birth but recent appointments have been of a high calibre and with help and guidance from Central Government, it appears to be making progress in terms of its governance and clarity of purpose. This is none too soon! Rob Bridge has a solid background in local government, and we wish him well.

£2 bus fare extended

The Government subsidy capping bus fares at £2 per journey was due to end this month but has been extended to the end of June.

Zero Carbon Communities grant

The popular ZCC grant from South Cambs is open for bids until 2 June 2023. There is a pot of £125,000 available for community groups and parish councils to bid for up to £15,000 for a project that will help with the reduction of carbon emissions in the district. Potholes

The issue of potholes is raised with us every winter, when the issue is exacerbated due to the colder weather. However, this year the issue seems to be a lot worse than usual. Potholes are appearing at a faster rate than previously and holes that have been filled are reopening at a larger size than before.

Cambridgeshire Highways, which has responsibility for maintenance of public roads and footpaths, is attempting to address these as soon as possible. However, it is up against the usual constraints – staff and money. Its contractor only has a set number of repair crews that it can deploy and the department has a limited budget for filling potholes. The County Council pumps more and more money into the Highways budget every year but it is never enough to do the job thoroughly.

The Highways department is looking at improved technology to speed up and improve the quality of the process but this is some years off implementation. Its message is to keep reporting potholes via the website (www.cambridgeshire.gov.uk/residents/travel-roads-and-parking/roads-and-pathways/roadworks-and-faults). The more reports received of certain holes, the greater the council's perception of the issue.

Food waste trial

For those who have voluntarily taken part in the food waste collection trial for the last three years, thank you. The trial concluded at the end of March with three years of data under its belt. The government is insisting that food waste is collected separately by the end of 2027 and the District Council (responsible for collecting our rubbish) wanted to see if people would use a separate food caddy correctly. The good news is that over 90% of participants in the trial did, so this will be the likely new method of food collection in the future.
