From the Seven Churches

"Whatever next?!" I seem to hear myself increasingly asking this question as I watch the news, read the newspaper or follow the multiple online sources of information that constantly bombard us. Certainly, so far this year we seem to have been subjected to a torrent of bad news, depressing forecasts, inhuman behaviour and horrific events that, were I to possess any, would make my hair stand on end! However, before concluding that the world is going to hell in a handcart and abandoning all hope, I have to encourage myself and, I hope, you to pause and take stock for just a moment. I sometimes remind myself that when I was a boy the news was a 10-minute bulletin on the wireless and salacious stories the province of a certain kind of newspaper — so is everything now much worse? Or, if we can shut out the noise and distraction for a moment, is there something else we need to hear?

In the life of the Church we go through something of a rollercoaster ride of events during the first part of the year, starting with God sending his only Son as a baby into this world to save us from ourselves, we then hear of his amazing life and ministry, plumb the depths of his suffering and death on the Cross and are then given the sure promise of eternal life in his Easter resurrection. But, just when we think it is safe, on Ascension Day Jesus disappears back into heaven perhaps leaving us wondering "Whatever next?" Jesus however never leaves us without hope and on the first Pentecost Sunday the promised comforter in the form of the Holy Spirit came upon the disciples and set their hearts and lives on fire, transforming them from an anxious band of believers into an ever-growing, confident church ready to take the good news of Jesus to the farthest corners of the then known world. As we read in the Acts of the Apostles, the task was not easy or without significant cost but in the love of God and power of the Holy Spirit all things are possible and the results beyond our wildest dreams. Are we ready for that – whatever next?

There are six Ukrainians living in Abington in four households. Many Ukrainians are now living independently and have integrated into local communities.

If a private landlord wishes to rent property, support and advice about the Landlord Incentive Scheme can be found on www.scambs.gov.uk/landlordincentive-scheme. They can receive a 'thank you' payment of £1000 and a month's rent in advance.

VE Day Tea



On 8 May the Village Institute, decked out with patriotic bunting, was the venue for a VE Day commemoration tea attended by over 40 Abington residents. Some of those present were indeed able to recall the day itself. Refreshments were served at two long tables, recreating the street party atmosphere of the original 1945 celebrations. Organised by Gaynor Farrant and Gill Smith, and with the assistance of a team of helpers, a full afternoon tea was served. This included a range of sandwiches, scones and cream, and a

selection of scrummy homemade cakes [see picture], which ensured that no one went hungry. And as a reminder of the gastronomic pleasures of wartime fare, there was also an opportunity to sample a Spam or a crab paste sandwich.

Thanks are due to the Abington History Group for a fascinating display of wartime documents and for decorating the hall with copies of wartime posters. Len Mead also put on show an intriguing array of papers and objects originally gathered together by his father during his wartime service. All this combined to create an afternoon of warm camaraderie in the best Abington tradition, and was a fitting reminder of the sacrifices made by so many in those years of war.

District and County Councillors' Annual Report 2025 County Council

Kingsway Solar Farm

This year our area has been approached by a solar developer with plans for a very large solar farm in the fields between Balsham, West Wratting and Weston Colville. If the plans are granted planning permission it would be the largest solar farm in the country – some 1,500 hectares – and would be larger than Heathrow Airport, Newmarket or the built-up parts of Cambridge. The applicant engaged in an 'informal consultation' at the back end of 2024 and is due to launch a 'formal consultation' in the summer of 2025. We would encourage everyone to engage with this, regardless of proximity to the site, as it will be one of the largest developments in our area and will affect us all in some way. Due to the scale of the proposal, the final decision will be made by a government planning inspector rather than by any of the local councils. Civil Parking Enforcement

Civil Parking Enforcement (traffic wardens) was introduced in South Cambridgeshire over a year ago. Despite a number of tickets being issued in that time, the problem of bad/illegal parking persists. The scheme is funded until 2029, after which it needs to be self-funding or it could cease. There is a link on the County Council's website where regular poor parking can be reported.

Anaerobic Digesters

Over the past few years, we have had planning applications submitted for two separate anaerobic biodigester plants in our area, one in Streetly End and the other just over the Suffolk border outside Haverhill. Mid-way through 2024 planning permission was granted for the plant in Streetly End, so construction of this can now commence, if the applicant still wants to proceed with it. A decision will be made about the plant in Suffolk in June 2025. As there are official objections from the Highways Department and the Environment Agency, we will be surprised if it is granted planning approval.

Local Government Reform

This year, the government announced that it has plans to reduce the number of local councils in the country and merge them into unitary authorities – this will mean one local council that delivers all the services that the District and County Councils currently undertake. The government has asked local councils to put forward proposals for what they see as sustainable geographic areas in which these new unitary councils would operate. In South Cambridgeshire the starting point is a joint council that covers Cambridge City and South Cambridgeshire, as a lot of the services, such as waste collection, planning and legal, are currently shared already. There could be a case for extending the area to include either Huntingdonshire or East Cambridgeshire but the starting point for negotiations will be the Cambridge City/South Cambridgeshire combination. We appreciate that the majority of people won't care what form their local council takes, as long as the services provided continue in as an efficient manner as possible. However, a change of this magnitude represents a significant upheaval, in local government terms, so watch this space.

Local Elections

On 1 May this year there were local elections for the County Council and the Cambridgeshire & Peterborough Combined Authority (the Mayor). Henry was absolutely delighted to have been reelected to represent the Linton division on the County Council – thank you to everyone from all 13 villages in the Division for putting your trust in him again. Regardless of whom you voted for, he will continue to do his best for our part of the world. The Liberal Democrats now have control of the County Council as they won just over half the seats. The overall composition of the County Council, by number of seats, is now:

- Liberal Democrat 31
- Conservative 10
- Reform 10
- Labour 5
- Green 3
- Independent 2

The Conservative candidate, Paul Bristow, won the Mayoral election.

District Council

Cambridge 2050

The current government is continuing to support massive development in and around Cambridge City and South Cambs. The prospect of something like 150,000 new houses in the area over time will mean significant changes. But before any of this becomes reality there are many hurdles to overcome, not least the issues with water and electricity shortages as well as transport infrastructure issues. These are problems the new Unitary Authority will have to tackle when it comes into being.

Four-day Week

After more than two years of trials, extensive analysis of performance and delaying issues with the previous government we are, at last, about to decide on whether or not to make the four-day week permanent. The decision will be made at the July Full Council meeting considering the results of all the independently assessed performance data, including financial implications and the results of the public consultation. All indications are that the trial has been a success.

Food Waste Collection

It is planned to introduce a separate food waste collection next year. This is government policy and we are obliged to introduce the new scheme. It will mean having a caddy for food only – it will no longer be possible to add food waste to the green bin. This is a major operation for the District Council, requiring an additional 22 vehicles and around 75 new staff. Much, but not all, of the initial cost is to be met by government grants. Extra costs will have to be met by the Council.
